IM-PER-A-TIVE: crucial importance; an order that is given

SPEC-TER: something widely feared an unpleasant occurrence; a ghost

EN-DORSE: to declare your support of something

DE-CI-MATE: to kill or to destroy completely

PRI-VA-TIZE: to change from government run to privately run, the opposite of NATIONALIZE

SUS-PI-CIOUS: describes the feeling when you think something or someone is wrong or distrustful

PUN-I-TIVE: describing a punishment

SIEGE: surrounding and blockading a city

SIM-MER-ING: to be filled with emotion and anger; to cook just near boiling

GRAN-DI-OSE: excessive, grand, too ambitious

CRED-I-BIL-I-TY: how convincing someone is, how much someone is able to be believed,

SPI-RAL: circling around a center and getting closer or farther away

LOF-TY: a noble ideal; also, too proud

PRO-FI-TEER: someone who makes too much of a profit; unfairness in business

WAN-TON: deliberate cruel action from someone that comes out of nowhere

IN-NO-VA-TIVE: advance and original; featuring new ideas and uses of a product

DE-FER-MENT: delaying or putting off military service
